DX CLIPS

I plan to offer a few tips on DX operating occasionally. These are intended to benefit the less experienced or newer members. I anticipate that the ever increasing sunspot numbers will entice some who have pursued other areas of interest to taste HF DX. Watch out - the "BUG" may bite you!

A few DO'S:

1. Listen , listen , listen - there may be some rare ones buried under the QRM/QRN.
2. Take advantage of the many legitimate nets that operate on a regular schedule. It is an easy orderly way to get your "feet wet" on HF DX.
3. Don't be intimidated by the purists who, although well - meaning , suggest that nets are taking the shortcut and somehow cheapen the DX credit.

A few DON'TS:

1. Don't presume that the DX is listening on his transmit frequency and call there. Listen for his/her instructions. They will tell you (e.g. 5 up; 200-205). Remember rare DX almost always operates "split".

2. Don't call out of turn. If the DX station is a savvy operator he will listen by the #'s to handle a big pileup: 1's, 2's ++. Some DX stations will mark down those callers and "will not hear them" when their turn comes.

SEVERE WEATHER

Hello to all, Now that summer is over and the leaves are falling. It's time to get ready for winter. Can you find your snow shovel? This month, to get every one in the mood for snow, I'd like to re-familiarize you with the different watches and warnings.

WINTER STORM WATCH: severe winter weather conditions may affect your area. (freezing rain, sleet, heavy snow may occur)

WINTER STORM WARNING: severe winter weather conditions are imminent or occurring.

HEAVY SNOW WARNING: a snow fall of at least 4 inches in 12 hours or 6 inches in 24 hours is expected. (under certain conditions, heavy snow may be included in a Winter storm warning.

BLIZZARD WARNING: considerable falling and/or blowing snow and winds of at least 35 miles per hour are expected for several hours.

HIGH WIND WARNING: sustained winds of at least 40 miles per hour or gusts of at least 50 miles per or greater are expected for at least one hour.

Know how to protect yourself:

BEFORE THE STORM: prepare-automobile, battery power, heating fuel, food, and other supplies.

DURING AND AFTER THE STORM: dress warmly-wear multiple layers of clothing, scarves, mittens.

AVOID TRAVEL: if stranded, stay in your vehicle, keep it ventilated, bundle up.

AVOID OVEREXERTION: shoveling snow or freeing stuck vehicles can be extremely hard work. Don't overdo it!

NEWS BITS

WASHINGTON, DC, Oct. 21, 1998--The FCC has issued its long-awaited Report and Order on the Universal Licensing System, which affects all Wireless Telecommunications Bureau licensees. Among other things, the ULS will result in replacing the familiar FCC Form 610 series with a new Form 605. The new rules become official 60 days after publication in The Federal Register--sometime around the end of the year. The FCC has said the ULS will "fundamentally change" the way the Commission receives and processes wireless applications and makes licensee information available to the public.

As part of its Report and Order on the ULS, the FCC also issued amended rules (in WT Docket 96-188) to authorize visiting foreign hams to operate in the US pursuant to recent international reciprocal operating agreements. This means that foreign hams holding a CEPT radio-amateur license from a CEPT country or an International Amateur Radio Permit issued by a participating CITEL country could operate while visiting the US without having to apply for permission. The FCC noted that the new system is similar to the one already in place for US and Canadian hams to operate in each other's countries.

The FCC said it will require the submission of a Taxpayer Identification Number by applicants and licensees using ULS, "consistent with the requirements of the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996." Some commenters, particularly amateur operators, argued against the requirement, the FCC said. Those opposing mandatory disclosure of a TIN--typically a Social Security Number--said it raised privacy concerns and was unnecessary to the Commission's regulatory goals. The FCC said it has instituted security measures to limit access to TIN data both on-line and to FCC staff.

HAMS HELP NAB POLICE RADIO JAMMER

A Connecticut Amateur Radio tracking team called Capitol Region Malicious Interference Tracking (CRMIT--pronounced "Kermit") helped lead authorities to a man they believe was interfering with local public safety communications. Wethersfield, Connecticut, police arrested Joel Langdo of Hartford September 29. He's been charged with criminal mischief, interfering with police and breach of peace. Langdo also could face similar charges in other communities as well as Federal charges.

Langdo, a security guard who does not hold an amateur license, allegedly used a modified ham radio hand-held to transmit on police and fire frequencies used by as many as three dozen Connecticut public safety agencies. At one point, he is said to have jammed the Manchester, Connecticut, police system for 15 minutes.

Tracking down Langdo took several months of often grueling detective work and careful documentation of offending transmissions, according to CRMIT spokesman Bruce Marcus, WA1NXG, an ARRL Life Member who's in the land-mobile business. Last April, Manchester Police solicited help from CRMIT, which, in turn notified the FCC. CRMIT helped Manchester authorities solve another malicious interference case several years ago.

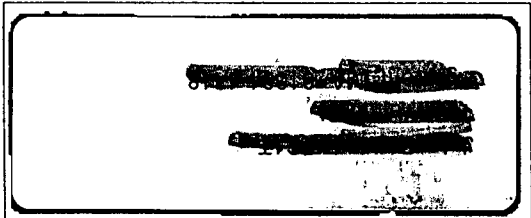

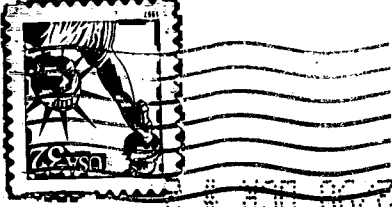
