HCRA Board regretfully says "goodbye" to Dave/N1MFL


Thanks for two years of faithful service

HAM Radio License Class and Study Groups

The Hampden County Radio Association will be holding an Amateur Radio Technician Class along with General and Extra Study Groups at the Holyoke Hospital Auxiliary Conference Center (auditorium), 575 Beech Street, Holyoke, Mass. This classes and study groups are open to everyone of all ages and affiliations.

There will be three different meeting dates:

Class #1 - Monday, January 13, 2014 7:00 - 8:30 PM Class #2 - Monday, January 20, 2014 7:00 - 8:30 PM Class #3 - Saturday, January 25, 2014 9:00 AM - 3:00 PM VE Exam - Saturday, January 25, 2014 at about 3:00 PM Attendance is NOT taken. If you can't make the Monday evening dates, just come on Saturday.

These condensed meetings are presented with the assumption that individuals will study and take practice tests on their own outside of class time. Our goal is to provide experienced ham radio operators (elmers) to be used as resources when going over the questions and answers that may be on the test.

There is no charge for the class/study group, but the purchase of the ARRL License Manual (\$29) is strongly suggested. Internet links to other resources will be provided. ARRL License Manuals can be ordered for delivery at the first class by contacting John, kx1x@arrl.net.

The cost to take the test is \$15 per attempt. Two forms of ID are required, including one picture identification.

ARRL 10 Meter Contest December 14-15, 2013

Starts 0000 UTC Saturday; runs through 2359 UTC Sunday

10 meters is OPEN, people! If there has ever been a time in the last 11 years to operate in the ARRL 10 meter contest, it's NOW! As many of you know, it is an HCRA tradition to enter this contest not only as individual operators, but also as a club. This means that the scores of every participant who submits a log with Hampden County Radio Association in the club field will be combined for a club score entry. Last year we had 11 HCRA members submit logs with a combined score of 466,188. I would be great to have more members participate this year and with conditions looking good, maybe much higher scores.

Contesting is all about setting goals and as like last year, we will be offering a goal and an incentive to achieve it. Any club member that makes over 100K in points during the contest will receive a Dunkin Donuts gift card. So if you've been thinking about trying out contesting or just want to make some contacts on 10 meters, put aside some time that weekend and work a few for yourself and for the club. 2013 SKYWARN™ Recognition Day

December 7, 2013, from 0000Z to 2400Z

SKYWARNTM Recognition Day was developed in 1999 by the National Weather Service and the American Radio Relay League. It celebrates the contributions that volunteer SKYWARNTM radio operators make to the National Weather Service. During the day SKYWARNTM operators visit NWS offices and contact other radio operators across the world. Separate stations will also individual QSL cards. See the web site for a list at http://hamradio.noaa.gov.

SKYWARN™ Recognition Day Operating Instructions:

- 1. Object For all amateur stations to exchange QSO information with as many National Weather Service Stations as possible on 80, 40, 20, 15, 10, 6, and 2 meter bands plus the 70 centimeter band. Contacts via repeaters are permitted. SKYWARNTM Recognition Day serves to celebrate the contributions to public safety made by amateur radio operators during threatening weather.
- 2. Date NWS stations will operate December 7, 2013, from 0000 2400 UTC.
- 3. Exchange: Call sign, signal report, QTH, and a one or two word description of the weather occurring at your site ("sunny", "partly cloudy", "windy", etc.).
- 4. Modes: NWS stations will work various modes including SSB, FM, AM, RTTY, CW, and PSK31. While working digital modes, special event stations will append "NWS" to their call sign (e.g., N0A/NWS).
- 5.Station Control Operator: It is suggested that during SRD operations a non-NWS volunteer should serve as a control operator for your station.
- 6. Event and QSL Information: The National Weather Service will provide event information via the internet. Event certificates will likely be electronic and printable this year. Stay Tuned!

FD Wrap Up

(Ed, KB1NWH) Well, the scores are in, and after a trying and fun Field Day here is what we got:

Matt, W1MSW and Ed, KB1NWH did an outstanding job as did all that made it possible for our first time at a new location. A big round of applause goes to the Hampden County Radio Association with call W1NY for finishing 7th out of 79 other 5A stations. We managed to accomplish 2387 QSOs for total points of 7966.

Here is a couple of general *overall* FD stats: 528,569 CW Qs were made, 51,103 Digi Mode Qs were made, 689,244 Phone Qs were made, for a whopping 1,268,916 QSOs total. There were 36,560 participants and 2,548 entries.

Again congratulations to all that help put W1NY near the top.
