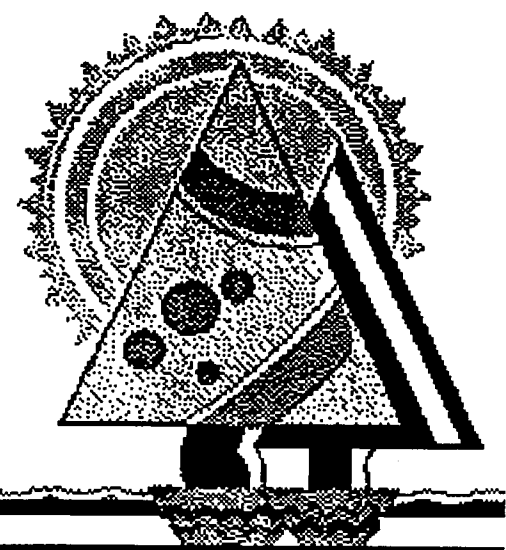
Magmount Wanted

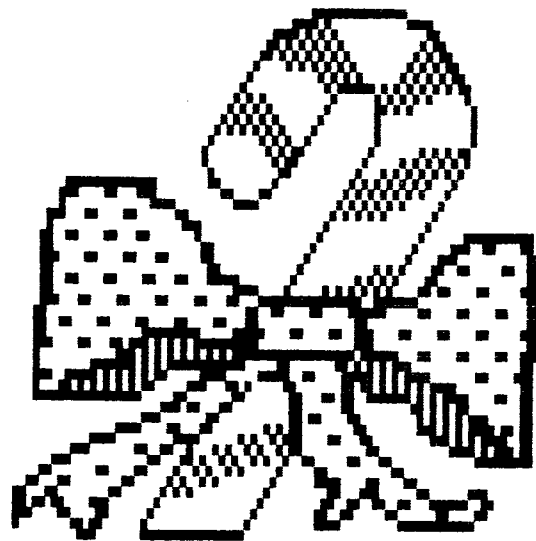
Membership Cards Available

Science Museum A Success

The HCRA's demonstration of amateur radio at the Springfield Science Museum was a big success. The Hampden County Radio Association club call, W1NY, is available to all licensed Hams that are members of the HCRA. You may use the call to operate as W1NY from your own home, or a location of your choice. The club will even provide the QSL cards, although you must provide your own postage. Prior approval is required from the Board of Directors. If you have a particular event you would like to operate as W1NY, it is suggested that you apply as soon as possible to reserve the call. Thanks to everybody who worked us.

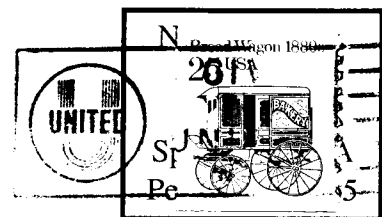
