February 2020 Presidents Message

It certainly has been a wild winter so far. A few weeks ago, we had the thunder snow, which made for great conversation and stories on the HCRA Monday night 10m net. Every Monday night at 7:30 pm local time on 28.375, we have the net. It's a great way to find out what everyone is up to and meet new people. It's always interesting and is also a great welcome to hams new to HF.

Working along the success of the 10m net, the HCRA will soon be starting a 2m net on the 146.715 W1BR (PL 100.0) repeater. This will be run just like the 10m net and will be a comfortable and welcoming place for new hams with 2m radios to become comfortable getting on the air and chatting. We hope to get this 2m net operational around the March meeting.

We are also excited to announce a Tech Class the weekend of March 21 and 22. In one weekend, you will be able to walk away a licensed ham after taking the class and test on Sunday afternoon the 22nd of March. The Saturday class will run 8 am to 6 pm and continue on the next day. Sunday sessions will run 8 am to 2 or 3 pm with testing by the NT1K Laurel VEC Group immediately afterwards.

Vanessa, W1IRL has volunteered to organize this class and there is a need for instructors. If you would like to teach one module or multiple modules, please contact Vanessa at: webmaster@hcra.org and volunteer. If you would like to teach certain things, please provide that information as well. We will also be raffling off at least 3 per-programmed with local repeaters, 2m HT's with accessories to those that took the HCRA class and passed their Tech license that weekend!

These classes are just the beginnings of HCRA classes. We hope to do at least 2 classes a year with Tech and General to start. The goal is for 2 Tech and one General in the next 18 months and continue beyond that.

We are also doing at least one follow up class to get new hams on the air, give them some hands on and much more. There will be much more info in the March ZeroBeat. That session is Saturday, March 28th from 10 am to 1 pm, the Saturday after the testing session.

The HCRA is also doing another kit build. Last years Fox Hunt antenna and attenuator building session was a HUGE success. We are following that up with a CW Reader kit build session on Saturday, April 25th at 10 am and runs to 3 pm. But it is likely you will be done before then. This will be a fun project where you'll learn how to solder (if you don't already know), have fun building a project that is also useful and really works! The deadline to sign up and pay for this is the March 6th meeting. Your cost is just \$25. You can sign up and pay at the February and March meetings or send a check to the PO Box.

We're also doing another Arduino build and training session. This one is on Saturday, May 16th. If you already have a kit, you can sign up and bring yours with you. If you want a kit, you can sign up and pay and build yours at the class. Estimated cost is \$30 and will be confirmed very soon. This session will run 10 am to 3 pm. The deadline to sign up and pay for this is at the Friday, April 3rd meeting.

Speaking of the April 3rd meeting. It is one of our most popular meetings every year. It's Show and Tell. A chance for you to show what you have built or assembled in the past 12 months since last years Show and Tell. It's a great way to see what everyone has been up to and what cool things they've built. Last years was certainly interesting and this year should be equally as interesting!

It's also not too early to start thinking about Field Day weekend in June. Just think about it for now!

The HCRA has big plans for the rest of this year and for the next 18 to 36 months! I hope you will not only attend the meetings, but also participate and contribute. The board has big plans for the future and we hope you will be part of them!

Things are happening in the world of Amateur Radio. ARRL is our advocate for Government, education and organization. I hope everyone that is a member of HCRA is also a member of ARRL.

Changes at the top

At its meeting this weekend, the ARRL Board of Directors did not elect Howard Michel, WB2ITX, as the ARRL Chief Executive Officer. Beginning Monday, January 20, Barry Shelley, N1VXY, will become interim CEO. Mr. Shelley was ARRL's Chief Financial Officer for 28 years and CEO during 2018 before his retirement. The board has created a search committee to select the next CEO. More details on this and other matters which took place at the board meeting will be released shortly.

QST—<u>THE</u> ham radio magazine

While it does have a goodly number of ads in it (at least they are relevant to the hobby—not for cruises or AARP) there are a ton of well written articles as well as reader (member) submissions.

Clubs—like ours


Our club is like many others. Affiliated with ARRL (we are a special service club) with much more going on than just meeting every month. Not just our club—but others near and far.

Membership is just \$49/yr, less than a weekly coffee at Dunks...



This is the clublog with open dates—basically a history from the start of each persons log. As you can see, many of the top members have many years on the air.




