Presidents Message for March 2020

If you haven't heard yet, there is a LOT to get excited about with the HCRA in the next few months.

We need YOU to help spread the word for the Earn Your Tech License in a Weekend Class. It's happening on Saturday and Sunday; March 21 & 22. They are all day classes with testing $\frac{3}{4}$ of the way thru Sunday. A participant could walk away with a Tech license. There is a flier you can print and post in your work place, libraries, post office and any place with a bulletin board or lets you post a flier. Here's the link to the flier.:

http://www.hcra.org/licensing-classes/ The club will be supplying bottled water during both days and will be providing a pizza lunch for the students and teachers on Sunday. PLUS all students who pass their Techs get entered in a raffle to win a 2m HT plus acces-

sories for free. The Saturday after the test, we are doing a followup meeting with the new hams to help them get on the air and to demo some modes like portable HF operation, DMR and more.

Some time in March we will be starting a HCRA 2m net similar to the 10m net. It will be a welcome place for any HCRA member and any newly licensed ham to get some on air experience. This will give new hams a friendly place to get on the air and get comfortable getting on the air and be able to ask questions w/o worry of those "that give ham radio a bad name" by talking down to them and discouraging them. It will be a friendly and social place for all. We will be hosting this net on the 146.715 (PL 100.0) W1BR repeater which is located on the Soldiers Home in Holyoke. We have permission to use this repeater.

We're holding a build session for a CW Decoder/Reader. It is scheduled for April 15th with the last day to sign up at the MTARA Flea Market on March 7th. Cost is just \$25 and the kit can be built in a few hours. For those that need soldering help, assistance will be there. The kit has a 4 line, 40 character display. Bob, WA1OJN, one of the organizers for this project built one and says it works quite well. We hope to have an online sign up soon. Check the HCRA.org web site often. You MUST be paid in advance to participate. To sign up, send an email to NF1G@arrl.net to be added to the list and pay at the meeting or the flea market.

How would you like to learn how to build and program an Arduino? The HCRA is holding a build and learn session on Saturday, May 16^{th} . The cost is just \$25 if you need the kit or free if you have one and just want to learn more about it. The deadline to sign up and pay is the April meeting. Contact NF1G@arrl.net to sign up.

Guess what is coming up fast? Field Day of course. Field Day is the largest HCRA activity. The field is already reserved for our use. Plans are being made. A sign up sheet will be passed around at the March meeting. Make sure you put June 26 to 28 in your calendar and make yourself available. We will need set up help on Friday, set up help on Saturday morning, operators for the 24 hours of the event for cw, ssb and other modes such as satellite and maybe digital. We need someone to be in charge of the food and cooking. Plus help tearing down and storing on Sunday. Also needed is someone to pick up the trailer and tow it to the field on Friday and return it on Sunday. ARRL STUFF

Things are happening in the world of Amateur Radio. ARRL is our advocate for Government, education and organization. I hope everyone that is a member of HCRA is also a member of ARRL.

ARRL Periodical Archive Search

Members can search online for articles, tech info, past reviews etc. from just about any ARRL publication. You can dig back to 1915 in QST articles. Vaguely remember an article on a Collins radio tech review from when you first got your license? Its there.

I'll admit its not as quick as google, but the info is there. Articles, letters from members, regulation changes...

So, your XYL may be right—you don't need all those magazines stacked around your shack. You just need to go to http://www.arrl.org/arrl-periodicals-archive-search and type in some keywords. Newer hams have access to decades of info without having to have all those years of magazines and membership.

Public Service in Amateur Radio

As we heard recently from Bob Meneguzzo K1YO—ARES is growing in Western Mass. This used to be the most public face of amateur radio, and as Bob told us, lack of organization and formality kinda tarnished that image. But the Western Mass section is getting things back on track

I still remember just after the hurricane in PR, listening to the ARRL volunteers on 20m passing info to the mainland. And there was recently a call put out for volunteers to help with the Boston Marathon. FCARC, our fellow club up in Greenfield is active in supporting local races and activities (and welcomes anyone that wants to join in).

Logbook of the World

Probably the definitive electronic logbook for confirmed QSOs. This is the one all the DXpeditions use, the "proof" for many awards. It's like a passport stamp for your contact log—it is legitimate.

ARRLs Logbook of the World confirms your contact by matching the information from the other party to yours. Once both parties have submitted matching log info, it is a confirmed contact. Uploading contact information is much like uploading a contest log, and once you are setup, most logging programs will do it easily.

It is free, it is secure, and it does not require membership in ARRL. It is recognized worldwide.

So, if you are thinking about DX awards, or any verified contact award—this is the way to have proof of the contact (if the other party also uses LoTW). It's either this or QSL cards.



I think this is a great way to review the principles we have learned getting our licenses, or learning something new.


Thanks Juergen for the idea for the page, and hopefully more of these to come. NV1Q will explain this at the next meeting ;-)



How well do you know Ohm's Law and Kirchhoff's Law?


Each of these resistors that make up the cube is 1Ω . (R1 to R12) What is the total value R_{total} between "A" and "B"?

Info from 2/29/2020




This is the clublog for 2020. You can see a different order of participants. But also some newer Hams getting active—awesome!


