### **EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS**

#### BY K1II, HCRA EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS DIRECTOR

Hurricane / Flood in 1955, East Coast Power Grid Failure in mid 1960 (all but Holyoke Water Power!), Bradley Airport Tornado, recent blizzards and ice storms....

Is this a memory quiz? Does history repeat itself? I could go on, but what is being stressed is that radio amateurs need preparation for emergency communications. From past experience and encountering MURPHY'S LAW during Field Day events the following questions for basic emergency communications are asked. **Do you have a communications emergency kit?** If so, in it do you have:

FLASHLIGHT, extra batteries and bulb
SPARE FUSE ASSORTMENT
WIRE NUTS, ELECTRICAL TAPE, DUCT TAPE
VOLT- OHM METER
COAX CONNECTOR ADAPTERS (UHF barrel, UHF to BNC, UHF to N, etc.)
COAX with connector to make emergency 1/4 wave ant. by stripping braid back
JUMPER WIRE with alligator clips
BASIC TOOLS
SPECIFIC REQUIRED ITEMS for your particular XCVR or HT
AA / NICAD or 12 volt source batteries
MAGNET MOUNT ANTENNA

This is by far not a total checklist, but a basic start for communications operation when an emergency/ disaster strikes. All ARES and RACES trained operators should have a complete deployment kit. A strong recommendation for all amateurs is to obtain the ARRL published **ARES FIELD RESOURCES MANUAL** (\$5.00 and well worth it), to participate in Public Service events and to enjoy operating in this year's Field Day on June 13 and 14th. Not only is it fun and nurtures our self- esteem, but it sharpens our communications operating skills.

As a reinforcement to the emergency communications readiness need, the States of Alabama, Florida, Virginia, and Tennessee, have very recently been devastated by tornadoes with little or no warning. Are you the proverbial ostrich with it's head in the sand believing it ain't gonna happen or don't wanna hear about it and don't care? Or are you emergency communications ready and trained, prepared to serve your immediate family and others in time of need?
