

The Submarine Force Museum, Library and Historic Ship Nautilus

The Submarine Force Museum, located on the Thames River in Groton, Connecticut, maintains the world's finest collection of submarine memorabilia. It is the only submarine museum operated by the United States Navy, and as such is the primary repository for artifacts, documents and photographs relating to U.S. Submarine Force history. The museum traces the development of the "Silent Service" from David Bushnell's Turtle, used in the Revolutionary War, to the modern Los Angeles, Ohio and Seawolf class submarines.

Upon leaving the museum, we will be stopping somewhere (to be determined) for lunch.



Then we'll be heading back North to the Vintage Radio and Communication Museum of Connecticut. Some of the displays include: radio, television, motion picture, telephone equipment, amateur radio equipment, industrial equipment, as well as vintage advertising and memorabilia.

One of the displays recently completed at the museum is an operating ham radio station reflective of the 1960s-1970s. Now a group of museum volunteers who are also ham operators has formed a club, and hopes to obtain a station

license and a "vanity" call sign that reflects the name of the museum.



Streams / rivers -also when nearing bank full
Coastal/ Street

After the storm has passed your location. DO NOT tell net control the storm has passed. Please stay off the air so that reports east of you can be taken. We don't need a summary of what has already happened. Please remember your safety during severe weather!
