

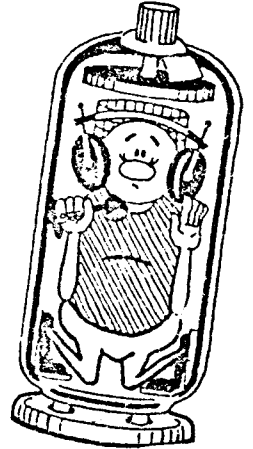

Opinion by K1BE

It's always sad to have one of our ham friends pass on. We all know that our turn awaits us. Plan now for the disposal of your ham radio equipment. Most wives have no idea what's in the shack, never mind its dollar value! Did you want to give your faithful telegraph key to a trusted friend for continued use? Will all your treasured club photos and momentos end up in the woodstove?

I would suggest you draw up a list to be kept in the ham desk or with your last will. (By the way, Massachusetts is not a good state to die in without a will. Two years after your death, the state and the lawyers will be richer, but not your loved one!) Put on this list the name, address, and phone numbers of trusted hams willing to help dispose of your gear. It's a good idea to ask their permission first, but not essential. List all of your major pieces of paraphenalia, and their approximate value. Any small items you want friends to have could be mentioned. Large, expensive items should be included in your will. A problem with setting values is that even though you paid \$800.00 for that Yaesu transceiver, the company has issued six new models since. So today it might only be worth \$300.00. QST ads, yellow pages, and dealer's used equipment prices should be used for reference.

People are people, and no one believes that tomorrow is the day the angels will come for them. For people who never make up a list I'd like to suggest an informal club policy. To help out the family, the club president could recommend two club members to handle the estate. The family could pick one and have them do one of several things:

1. Inventory the equipment and set a cash value.
 - a. make an "entire lot" purchase and re-sell the stuff to get the money back. (sometimes takes a whole year!)
 - b. Agree to sell the equipment for the family gratis, or for 10% commission plus expenses.
 - c. Help the family sell the estate by providing the places to put ads, etc.

It is a true labor of love and hard work to take care of an estate. If this policy is adopted, the club president should not buy any of the estate items to avoid any hints of collusion.

Years ago one of our old time HCRA members was going into the hospital for brain surgery. He took the time to send along some old issues of "Zero Beat". He died during the operation but because of his thoughtfulness, the club now has some valuable historical records. You all enjoyed the series: " Years Ago in Zero Beat". What better way to remember old friends? Set aside that HCRA memorabilia so that the club gets it.

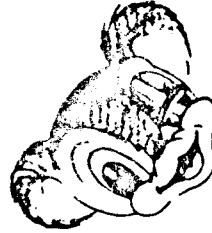
ARRL BULLETIN NR 24 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS

Volunteers would be permitted to assist FCC in monitoring violations of Amateur and CB rules and in preparing and administering FCC examinations under a bill just introduced into the House by U.S. Representative William E. Dannemeyer, Republican of California. The Bill, known as HR 2203, has been assigned to the Subcommittee on Telecommunications, Consumer Protection and Finance, Committee on Energy and Commerce.
