You like older radios but you've never heard of the CX Exchange! Shame This is the best (and most likely, only) radio contest where the old, old gear gets to chirp away. Here are some excerpts from the fall Classic Radio Exchange Newsletter: (Editor is a good friend of KlBE's) Hope this spurs you into trying this great contest!

Finally made it on 30M CW. Working on a portable set-up: BC-224, a Globe Scout (yest I still haven't got it working) and an all band single 813 era 1956 Handbook. (I drive a 3/4 ton Travelall -- "portable"!!) --Mike, W7DRA

Well another CX is over and there certainly was a lack of AM or SSB activity. Perhaps a few should fire up the Globe Kings and Valiants on AM alas. I did not get on 2M AM this time as I was busy that night; but in September I should be on 2M AM. The Johnson collection here is slowly getting larger; but good Vi.ing are very hard to find up here and very expensive. I should have the HF Thunderbolt amplifier on the desk by next September and possibly a Ranger or Navigator --Nike, VE3FGU as an exciter.

It sure was nice hearing the old familiar calls and rigs again. I tried running 40M SSB with my Apache but couldn't make any CX QSG: seems there has been a big resurgence of AM activity or the low bands -- even 20M. -- Dick, K8MIA

I would like to know if you (or anyone) is aware of any group or society operating an Amateur Radio Equipment Museum. If there is any such activity, I would be happy to denate some of my home-built rigs (and possibly some commercial also) if I could be assured they would be properly cared-for and displayed. Some of this equipment, o my way of thinking, belong to what I think can be properly described as the last generation of home-built equipment. As you are quite aware, the advent of SSB in the mid-50s caused almost a total swing to com-mercial built gear. I think it would be highly desireable if some of the old home-built rigs could be preserved so that the hams of the future could see how it was done "in the olden -- Bob Mitchell, KSWXR 1023 So. 22nd St. Rogers, AR 72756

Here is a list of stations I worked, but am not very good at adding up the score; but it was a lot of fun. My old equipment includes a RME69 and NC300. My old AM transmitter has been converted to a 4/1000A linear which I never use any more. So my present rig is a 14 year old Galazy GTSSOA. -- Francis, W9ACU

I am not a contest operator, but I enjoy this type of event. For the next contest I hope to operate 40M and 80M also. -- Rudy K2MVW

Got my old BC-610 transmitter and SX-17 receiver in shape again so drop me your news-letter when the next "CX" is due. --Chuck, W8AN

A copy of "The Classic Radio Newsletter" fell into my hands and I love it! How can I get on the mailing list? I don't have a lot of classic gear of my own, but I really love the old gear. I have a Runger I, Collins 75A3, 75A4, khS1, SC101, and a late S line, from soup to nuts. I'd give my eye teeth to get an old Hallicrafters \$29 -- my first shortwave receiver. -- John, WB8IPG

Masochist's delight: worked WASPEE using the Harvey-Wells
TBS-58D and the Atwater Kent receiver -- and he was using the newer Harv:y-Wells T-99 and receiving with a (choke! gasp!) S-38B (although no tuning eye -- inside joke). With that combination of receiving equipment on both sides one really had to be dedicated to get the QSO through!

Almost got the Baw 6100 on the air. With little luck in replacing the rf choke (plate circuit: 2.5 mh, 500 ma), I unwound the old one and wound a new one on the same form, using 124 magnet wire (enameled). It is installed and working just fine — but while tuning up initially it blew yet another filter capacitor (the fourth). I figured the first (original equipment) could have been ready to go; the second (junk box) was older mand used, ditto; the third (new) could have been defective; but when it blew the fourth (also new) I started looking elsewhere. I found a bad (very high resistance) bleeder resistor which skewed the voltage from across the blown capacitors... It seems that no two troubles are ever the same: each is a new experience! Anyway, with resistor and filter replaced I got the thing working last night, putting out about filter repliced I got the thing working last night, putting out about 60 watts on 80 meters. There are still some problems (like all the other bands), but at least it is functioning if only marginally. Maybe by next CX!

Oh -- W9ZEN, Johnny, gets the "WAS" award - the "Worked All Stephenses", that is: he worked Ben Stephens (K9KOM), me (N5AIT), and you (K9SJ) all in the same CX. A first, I believe -- anyone else manage to work all three of us brothers? We shall have to find an appropriate award, maybe from your vast store of surplus equipment.

Great time, as usual, and really nice to meet the CX family, even though we get together only twice a year (and sometimes at Dayton). Worked most of the usual gang, and was glad to hear some newcomers: worked most or the usual gang, and was glad to hear some newconners: even the guy who shall remain nameless who was trying out his new keyer for the first time! Great line-up of old rigs, about the best I have run across to date. We have come a long way from the original "NX" (Nostalgia Exchange), and I still think it is a great idea. Also great to finally log the "real" K8SJ and the mighty Lysco. Welcome back, Stu.

1985 Classic Radio Exchange

A fun and interesting radio event, 2100 UTC January 27 to 0400 UTC, January 28 Object is to restore, operate, and enjoy older equipment with like-minded hams. A Classic Radio is any equipment built since 1945 but at least ten years old: an advantage, but NOT REQUIRES in the Exchange. YOU CAN USE A NYTHING (except 3 KWI), although new gear is a distinct scoring disadvantage and rather boring. Exchange your name, RST, state/province/country, receiver and transmitter type (homebrew send P.A. tube, i.e. "6L6"), and other interesting conversation. The same station may be worked with different equipment combinations and on each band on each mode. CW call "CQ CX", phone call "CQ Exchange". NON-CON-TESTANTS MAY BE WORKED FOR CREDIT. Suggested frequencies: CW up 60 KHz from low band edges; phone 3910, 7280, 14280, 21380, 28580, Novice/Tech 3720, 7120, 28120.

SCORING: Multiply total QSOs (all bands and all equipment combinations used) by number of different receivers, transmitters, states, provinces, and DX countries worked on each band and mode. Multiply that total by your Classic Multiplier: total years old of all receivers and transmitters used, three QSOs minimum per unit. If equipment is a transceiver, multiply age by two.



MY TURN BY K1BE

I'd like to propose a new system using the latest technologies made available to ham radio operators. I haven't thought of a name for it so we are willing to take suggestions! The new packet radio systems being proposed suggests an idea to me: Put up satellites that use part-packet addressing systems, and voice. Low power hand-helds that have a microchip built in, automatically supply the unit designation These low-power, mobile rigs go into a with every transmission. special repeater. These repeaters use computer tracking methods to aim the signals at the nearest low-flying satellite, which would re-transmit the signals then, or wait until the station addressed is available. (Might be on the other side of the earth!) The mountain top repeater would have the role of taking the incoming FM or SSB signal, adding its' own identifier to the signal, locating the best satellite passing overhead, and transmitting the signal UP to that satellite. satellite would have the job of receiving hundreds of these signals, deciding where they're to be sent, and then re-transmitting or storing them for future re-transmission. For example, say NIAGV is out in his car and wants to talk to WBlHIH in Pittsfield. His hand-held automatically inserts his ID (might be a string of numbers) at the start of the transmission. The nearby "SATPEATER" (just coined the word!), takes his signal, adds its ID, and if a bird is available, retransmits it straight at the satellite. (May not be available at that moment, in which case it would store for future transmission. Or it might have to wait for an "OK to send" message from the bird.) Note that NIAGV doesn't hear his signal being repeated. (Uplinked to the bird.) The satellite would get the SATPEATER's signal, and know where it was This is stored in its' memory. It would know that WBlHIH uses the SATPEATER KIFFK/r and would downlink to that machine. The KIFFK SATPEATER would send out a query signal to WBlHIH's rig, and if the radio accepted the call, would transmit the signal. Then a two-way would be possible bewteen NIAGV and WBlHIH.

There is no reason why two very distant stations, say one in Germany and one in Africa could not QSO. The satellites could use the SATPEATER network to relay the signals down/up many times, or go directly between satellites with the signal. Digitally encoding the voice would make it error free, and not subject to doppler shifts, etc. There is no reason why we should be limited to packet radio in sophisticated linking systems! It would cost beaucoup bucks to pay for the system, but this type of technology would revolutionize ham radio. What do you think of my idea?




SPECIAL AWARD PRESENTED TO FRANK POITS, WALRWU!

TEN CARDINAL RULES FOR SELLING EQUIPMENT By Ed White, WINPL


- 1. Clean up the gear, making it presentable.
- 2. Permit a demonstration, or a trial period.
- 3. When stating the selling price, be firm about the figure. (Be certain what you want!)
- 4. If you wish to bargain, don't set the price.
- 5. If you're willing to ship it, be certain to state who pays the shipping costs.
- 6. Sometimes a better all-around transaction can be had by accepting a trade.
- 7. Under no circumstances, accept "\$10.00 down, and .50¢ a week!". If the buyer needs cash let him get a loan from the bank!
- 8. Should the equipment be defective, state it, and make sure the buyer knows it.
- 9. Don't be misleading. i.e. It was only used by a grandmother to set her father's watch to WWV!
- 10. Remember that the vast majority of hams are anxious to please the buyer.


