It was not so long ago that we had to use the mails or the phone or be lucky enough to work someone in the local area to get that same message through. I'm looking forward to our first contact via packet. It should be early in 1990.

P.S. I still shoot the M-1 carbine that the storyteller carried throughout Europe! (K1BE)


