



We are looking for anyone to help with Field Day this year. We are at the School Street Park again as in past years.

If you do not know what Field Day is, it is a practice emergency setup and operation that takes place every year over the 4th full weekend of the month of June.

We set up portable towers, antennas, tents or other shelters and HF stations in each. All power is from generator or other non-electrical line power source.

The fun begins 1pm on Friday, June 25th and ends when everything has been taken down and put away Sunday afternoon. The operating event runs from Saturday at 2pm through Sunday at 2pm. 24 hours straight through.

The Fox's Den

How HCRA Fox Box-2 was Built

The HCRA Fox Box 2

We are finally getting Fox Box 2 deployed. It took many, many more months than I had originally hoped for, but it is now deployed and being searched for just in time for warmer weather.

What is a fox box and how does it work? From this point on, we'll call this fox box FB2 for FoxBox2.

The foxbox is a semi-automated hidden transmitter. It is powered by a battery and has a controller and a HT inside. When a hunters transmitter is keyed on a certain frequency with a certain PL and certain DTMF tone, it activated the FB to transmit. You then use your gear to direction find and try to find the FB. As needed, re-activate the FB and direction Find (DF) again until you walk up to it. The battery should keep the FB usable for approximately 5 to 7 days before it needs recharging.



It all starts with an ammo box. From there we figure out how to mount everything and how to keep it safe with a locking mechanism. For this, I got together with Bob, W1BOB and we brainstormed and came up with a strong eye bolt and mounted it to the case. We had to modify the closing mechanism so that it worked and closed over the eye bolt so everything inside could be locked and safe. We also have a heavy duty cable and padlock to prevent theft.





Next we had to figure out how to keep the battery from moving around. A few pieces of wood strategi-



cally places holds the battery in place yet allows removal if needed. We needed a way to keep the HT in place. A bent piece of angle iron does the job nicely. A power switch to turn everything on and off easily. This little switch turns on the radio and interface so everything is off when not in use and not draining the battery. (left)

A coax jumper between the HT and the antenna mount works perfectly. This is an SMA mount plus a few adapters and right angle connectors to get it just right. In between hunts, the battery must be recharged. The battery stays in the FB during this time. But the charger comes out and gets plugged in. Powerpoles connect the charger to the battery and when done, connect the battery to the HT and interface.

It all looks like this when powered on. (below)



With the help of his four grandchildren and their four legged friend. Give it a try! Ride along with another hunter to lean the tricks. What better way to spend some time outdoors? THIS NEW SECTION IS FOR NEWLY LICENSED HAM'S

If you are a new ham or even a not so new one, you might not be using Anderson Power Poles as your connectors.

Like many of us, as a new ham, you might have started buying an inexpensive HT for VHF and UHF. If you buy a mobile or base VHF/UHF or HF radio you will need to power your it from a 12V battery or from an AC outlet. (Remember you can listen on any ham frequency but can only transmit on frequencies where you have privileges) Plugging to an AC outlet requires a power supply capable of providing 13.8V of DC power. The power supply should convert your home's AC 120 voltage to 13.8V of DC. Your radio's power cable might have wires without connectors and it is up to you to provide them, or not. You can just wrap the cable to the posts on the power supply, or the battery if using DC. That is not always an option as some power supplies do not have posts and only have Anderson Power Poles.

You can terminate the radio's cable using ring terminals to attach to a battery, spade style connectors to attach to a small battery, Anderson Power Poles, or nothing, among other alternatives. Regardless, I strongly advise you use Anderson Power Poles as they are commonly used by many. They are the standard connector for Emergency Communications (EmComm) groups. The power poles are foolproof to use, once they have been crimped correctly. There is no way you will con-

nect the negative cable to a positive terminal and vice-versa. You can install the power poles yourselves, which requires a specialized, and somewhat expensive, crimper to make the task easier or purchase ready made ones with power poles.







Just make sure you buy the right cable for your needs. I made a combination of cables and have at least one I purchased already made. Anderson Power Poles come rated for different amperage. I mostly use 30A ones, but need to order 45A ones for one cable I want to make to use a LiFEPO4 battery. The wire is 10AWG. The battery end will have ring terminals or I will just wrap the cables around it, the other end will have the Anderson Power Poles to connect my radio's poles.

Antique Radios

DID YOU EVER OPERATE AN ANTIQUE HAM RADIO?

Spring brings the return of antique cars to the road – did you ever want to drive one? It does look like fun, doesn't it?

Antique radios are similar – they can be a lot fun to drive! In this article and some future articles on this subject, we'll discuss the basics of finding and using vintage ham radios.

First, you may wonder why anyone would want anything but an SDR transceiver – the features that a modern radio can offer makes operating easier and more efficient. Secondly, what about fixing them and getting parts? But, to understand more about how



Ham Radio has developed over the years, using an old radio is a must. And, not only is it fun for the operator to get an old rig on the air, it is enjoyable to see the reactions of others when they hear that your radio is over 50 years old. Finally, just as it was easier to understand how an old car worked mechanically, it is also much easier to master the workings of an antique radio.

In the picture above, there is an image of a very nice station (W4IYC) from 1960. Featured is equipment by the Collins Company, which, in those days, was really the Cadillac of Ham Radio gear. The microphone in the photo is a classic, too – it is an Astatic brand which itself was popular from about 1933 to 2000. Now, here is the really interesting thing: much of the gear the station you see in the photo is still being used by Hams today.

Learning about vintage equipment is easy. There are online Facebook Pages and websites devoted to using and maintaining the equipment, as well as nets that meet regularly. For example, if you are interested in Heathkit equipment, there is a Heathkit Owners Group on Facebook:

DID YOU EVER OPERATE AN ANTIQUE HAM RADIO?



Here is a photo of my antique station:



Shown in the photo on the right is a Drake TR-4 Transceiver and above it an MS-4 speaker with a power supply installed – this radio was manufactured in 1965. On the left is a Heathkit SB 101 with a speaker and power supply, as well as an SWR/Power meter above it – all from about 1970. And, of course, there is an Astatic D-104 microphone. Finally, on the left is a Heathkit HW-32A Single Bander for 20 Meters SSB from 1966.

So, why do I have this station?

One reason is nostalgia – I got my license in the late 1960's. But, a more important reason is the same one why I like old cars: I can understand "what goes on under the hood" and, best of all, I can fix my own radios.
