
HCRA Field Day at School Street Park, will YOU be there?

HEATHKIT DIAL UPGRADE

Dial upgrade for the Heathkit HW-100 by Bill, W1FMX

The Heathkit HW-100 was a very popular H.F. transceiver in the late 1960s. It was marketed as an affordable SSB/CW transceiver that was not too difficult to build, was fun to operate, and worked fairly well.

However, one significant problem with the transceiver (later corrected in the HW-101) was that it had an unusual VFO dial mechanism that tended to make it difficult to “zero-beat” or tune in a station. Here is what was said about that dial on eham.net by Chris Codella, W2PA, in 2002: “It’s a really funky plastic planetary gear arrangement where the knob, which snaps onto the collar, pinches down on a flexible cup-shaped gear that meshes with one in the mount and turns the shaft. It’s fairly flimsy and prone to backlash.” The “back in the day” solution for HW-100’s VFO backlash problem was to purchase a VFO mechanism from Swan and attach that to the HW-100 instead of the original Heathkit mechanism.

Last year, I bought an HW-100 and restored it. Though it has performed well, the “backlash” problem with the VFO dial mechanism really was annoying. I looked around for an old Swan VFO mechanism but did not find one. Searching for another solution, I came across a posting by Ed Mohrman, WA7EM, on Heathkit Groups I.O. that he wrote about 5 years ago. He said that he had added a vernier to his HW-100 and was pleased with the result. So, I wrote to Ed and asked him about the modification he had done. Here is what he said in his reply about the VFO dial on his HW-100:

The slightest touch of the VFO knob shifted the frequency up or down in random amounts. I quickly learned that a better VFO was a major improvement between the HW100 and HW101. The 101's VFO has a built-in vernier. But the 101's VFO assembly can't be moved to the 100 due to changes in the chassis cut-outs.

I wanted any change I made to be "back-out-able." If a future owner of the radio favored the absolute original stock configuration, my modification could be removed with no cosmetic damage.

A vernier could be easily clamped to the VFO's shaft. But it stuck out a couple inches beyond the front panel, which I thought was really ugly. So, that began a multi-step campaign to reduce how far it stuck out. The major steps were to cut the vernier shaft, maybe 1", and to use a Dremel tool to hollow out the back side of the knob so that most of the vernier body was hidden inside the knob. I had to drill and tap a new set screw hole to attach the knob to the shaft. I also made a little collar out of PVC pipe to hide the rest of the vernier. The collar was maybe 3/4" and painted green to match the cabinet. After all that, I think the radio looked pretty good—almost stock!

After that, tuning was very smooth and stable. The negative was that tuning was in the backward direction. Because of the vernier gearing, to tune the VFO clockwise, you turned the knob counter-clockwise.

Unfortunately, there were no photos available to show how he had modified the HW-100, but included in that reply from WA7EM was information about the knob and the vernier he had used for his HW-100. Both parts are still available from MGS Max-Gain Systems, Inc. The 6:1 vernier Reduction Drive lists for \$14.95 (Part # SKU: VERN-01), and the fluted tuning knob (Part # SKU: MGS-KNOB-02) is priced at \$5.95

When the vernier and the knob arrived, I began to consider how I might attach them to the HW-100. After removing the dial knob from the HW-100 (this is easy to do: simply use a slotted head screwdriver and pry the knob off), I realized that it would also be useful to remove the “cup-shaped gear” that is placed on the VFO capacitor’s shaft. To remove the “cup gear,” I used a dental pick that is shaped like an “L,” which allowed me to hook the end under the inside lip of the “cup gear” and pull it free. The result was that, when the vernier was placed on the VFO shaft, it could be set slightly further onto it. (Note: the original Heathkit gear system will be somewhat greasy.)

With the VFO variable capacitor shaft freed of the original components, I fitted the vernier onto the shaft. It was immediately apparent that the shaft of the vernier would need to be cut down. WA7EM had mentioned that he had removed about 1” from the vernier’s shaft. I measured and removed about that same amount using a hacksaw. The remaining “stub” of the vernier shaft was now about 5/16” long, which eventually would be long enough to be compressed by the setscrew on the new knob I would use.

The vernier has mounting tabs on either side (see image below). In order to make the vernier fit as deeply into the opening for the HW-100’s VFO variable capacitor shaft, I decided to bend the tabs down.

The vernier attached easily to the VFO variable capacitor's shaft using two setscrews. But the next step was to decide how to "anchor" the vernier so it would work properly and yet not damage the HW-100. Ordinarily, two screws would anchor the vernier, but that could not be done here without drilling holes into the plastic structure of the HW-100. The solution seemed to be to attach supports to the sides of the vernier and somehow attach the other ends of those supports to the HW-100 without damaging it. The "supports" that I decided to use were actually pieces cut from a "folder fastener"—the kind that is bendable and used to hold papers in a file folder. (See image below.) The "bendable pieces" are very strong against a lateral force. I cut the two bendable pieces from the more solid base of the fastener and then cut each of those pieces in half, cleaned the ends, added some flux, and soldered the ends to the bent tabs on the vernier (which I also had pre-cleaned and pre-tinned with solder). Once soldered on, the pieces held in place well and seemed strong enough to anchor the vernier.

Next, the vernier was placed on the VFO variable capacitor shaft, and I trimmed each of the supports and bent them in so that the ends abutted the silver ring under the HW-100's dial and made sure that each of the ends was also up against two of the four screws that hold the original silver ring in place. Finally, I added a small dab of Super Glue to "tack" each of the two "supports" to the plastic surface. (Photo #8 below).

The next task was to add the knob to the vernier. However, in order to decrease the distance that the knob would extend from the front of the vernier dial, I followed WA7EM's idea of carving away some of the backing of the dial so it would fit more closely over the end of the vernier. Using a Dremel tool with a carbide bit, I removed enough of the plastic in the center of the back of the knob to create a "niche" for the end of the vernier. I also used a 1/2" drill bit to remove about 1/4" of the knob's inner brass sleeve for holding the knob on

the vernier shaft. The photo on the left (next page) shows the original back of the knob, while the second photo (next page) shows it with the "carved-out" back.

When the back of the knob was carved and the brass sleeve drilled down slightly, the original set screw in the knob could still be used to attach the knob to the shaft of the vernier. However, one problem remained: there was a gap between the knob and the front of the HW-100 that needed to be covered to make the installation look more professional. After several solutions were tried, it seemed to be that the best “fix” was to use a 1 ½” ABS Black Spigot and Hub Flush Bushing (Charlotte brand Part # 107 10 2x1 ½“ ABS 31-8329 DWV), which cost \$3.29 at the local hardware store (photos #12-13 below). Using epoxy, I cemented the side with a lip to the back of the knob; this gives a “finished” appearance to the knob and covers the gap between the front of the HW-100 and the back of the knob. Aside from its “cosmetic” purpose, a bonus is that the bushing can be used to move the vernier more quickly than simply turning the knob does.

Adding the 6:1 Vernier and the new knob does change the appearance of the HW-100 slightly, but the improvement in performance is well worth the difference. Using the bushing to turn the vernier, I can move “up and down” a band quickly, but then can easily “zero beat” a station using the new knob for more precise tuning. Frankly, it was surprising to me that the new set-up actually looks better than I expected - carving out the back of the knob allows the whole apparatus to be set closer to the front panel which improves the appearance of the new dial mechanism. And, of course, if the change is made and you do not like it, reverting back to the original dial mechanism is easy to do.

STORMS AND TORNADOES

Storms and Tornadoes: Amateur Radio Ready

Strong storms and reports of at least 60 tornadoes have wreaked havoc in the Central U.S. for nearly two weeks. Homes and businesses across Nebraska, Oklahoma, Texas, Missouri, and Iowa were destroyed, and power is still down for more than 30,000 residents. On May 1, 2024, President Joe Biden declared a major disaster exists in Oklahoma, making federal aid available to those affected by last weekend's severe storms in Hughes, Love, and Murray counties.

Section Manager of the ARRL Iowa Section, Lelia Garner, WA0UIG, re-

ported that in Iowa, they have moved from response to recovery. Currently, nine counties are under the Iowa State Individual Assistance Grant Program and the Disaster Case Advocacy Program.

"Amateur Radio has served our local agencies well. We recently networked at a central Iowa hamfest and are building our emergency communications capacity primarily through the Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES®). ARES resources include personnel, experience, meetings, training, communications equipment, and operating trailers. The opportunity to share our experience and knowledge gained in the field has been critical to supporting ARES in Iowa," said Garner.

Garner added that awareness is the best tool. She stressed that amateur operators and ARES members work to help the National Weather Service and other served agencies in order to make their work and the community safer.

ARRL Emergency Management Director Josh Johnston, KE5MHV, agrees that everyone should stay vigilant in their awareness and preparations, even during periods of less activity. Make sure you are prepared at home and that your family has a severe weather plan. This is extremely important if you plan to be mobile or away from your home during a severe weather event. Your safety is the most important thing if you plan to be active during severe weather. Every ham who is interested in severe weather should take the [SKYWARN storm spotting class](#) offered by the National Weather Service," said Johnston.

He added that some of the most important aspects of preparation are communication and building relationships. These activities, including drills and exercises, need to be done during blue - sky days to ensure you will be ready during days with severe weather.

The [ARRL Learning Center](#) offers courses like on Basic EmComm and Intro to Radio for Emergencies and Disasters.






