A Near Miss

An asteroid big enough to wipe out metropolitan Los Angeles whizzed past Earth last month in what scientists Wednesday called a cosmic near-miss. Henry Holt, an amateur astronomer from Flagstaff, Ariz., discovered the asteroid March 31 while working on a NASA-funded project for the U.S. Geological Survey. The asteroid, which measures half a mile across, passed within 500,000 miles of Earth.

Join the "CROWD" on packet!

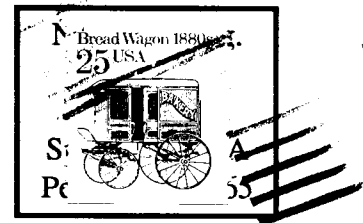
There is a new thing in packet radio, called **CROWD**. CROWD allows you to talk with several other users at once. It's similar to connecting to someone's station, and typing keyboard to keyboard with them. The difference is that CROWD allows you to talk to more than one person at once.

To connect to CROWD, connect to one of the BERK nodes: **BERK1** on **145.07**, **BERK2** on **221.11**, **BERK3** on **145.09**, or **BERK4** on **144.99**. Once connected to a BERK node, connect to CROWD.

Several commands on CROWD start with a slash (/) character. **/W** will tell you who else is on CROWD, and **/H** will give you help with the other commands. Anything you type that doesn't begin with a / will be sent to all other users on CROWD channel 0.
