

Wednesday October 13th, 2010

Meeting called to order at 7:15 PM, at St. Marks Episcopal Church in East Longmeadow, MA after a tour of the facility.

Officer Reports

Vice President - John Pise KX1X

Fall Classes – The technician level license class is under way at the Holyoke Hospital auditorium with a mix of local hospital staff and candidates from the general public. Currently there are 15 participants. John is looking for qualified instructors interested in presenting the remaining modules to the candidates and will submit information on the classes for the November ZB.

Treasurer - Dave Cain AA1YW

Club Balance: \$5340.19

K1JAW Donations: a motion was raised, seconded and carried by unanimous vote to increase the collected amount of \$220 to \$250 with supplemental funds from the club treasury. The secretary was directed to mail a \$250 check along with a letter of presentation to the director of the ARRL Scholarship Foundation in memory of Jim Whitehouse K1JAW on behalf of the membership of the HCRA. Raffle Proceeds: Matt Wilhelm will keep track of the sales and proceeds of the Auction and Generator raffles.

Secretary - Marty Bowen W1MJB

The September meeting minutes were approved. In the future, BOD meeting minutes will be submitted to the board members by e-mail for their approval or required changes. Once reviewed and with any changes made, the minutes will be considered to have been approved for publication and will be sent to the ZB editor for publication in the next ZB.

Current Member Count (regular & life) - 70

Non-profit Taxes: The yearly state and IRS filings for a non-profit, which must be filed by November 1st, are currently being prepared for submittal.

Club Breakfast: Since there are several other breakfasts on the first Saturday of the month, the BOD has decided to hold off on HCRA breakfast until further notice.

Zero Beat Director - Larry Krainson WB1DBY

Deadline for November ZB article submission: October 24th. – The BOD has decided that proof reading each ZB prior to electronic publication would be useful– Frandy has volunteered to be the proofreader.

New Monthly Column: Eli Harris will begin submitting a monthly column pertaining to current and planned activities of the BSA DX Crew to Larry for ZB.(KX1X will facilitate)

Marty suggested re-running some K1JAW articles in a few months to memorialize his contributions to HCRA.

Membership Director - Matt Wilhelm W1MSW

New members: none.

General Raffle Update: The auction and generator raffles ticket sales are going well.

ARRL 10 Meter Contest Planning: The HCRA website information for the contest is being updated and additional information on the set up and use of N1MM logger will be provided. Note that the same award system as last year will be used.

At Large-Frandy Johnson N1FJ

Reward certificate update: the outline that will categorize reward certificates could be greatly enhanced by ideas from the membership. These ideas can be e-mailed to the BOD reflector. The BOD is considering and would like to solicit suggestions for creating an annual K1JAW QRP award to be awarded at years end to the club member who has shown exemplary activity which promotes QRP operation.

Program Director - Jim Machia NN1Y

2011 February – Open April – Open May – Open **Presentation suggestions:** IRLP, repeaters, DXclusters, antennas design and antenna modeling, reverse beacon network, Expeditions, SOTA in America and classes on the installation and use of various loggers such as N1MM and DXLab.

DX Crew President–Eli Harris, KB1RIE – The DX crew currently has 15 members on the roster. Eli and the crew are looking for help from HCRA to implement activities that will bolster sagging interest in radio related youth activities. During their next scheduled meeting they will be generating an outline of possible activities such as kit building, CW practice, FMCW, participation in local Summits on the Air (SOTA) activities, refurbishing an aging Fox box for FM Fox Hunts for which they may need the assistance of the HCRA.

Chesterfield Shack: the DX crew director John KX1X and the crew's elected officers are working with the BSA to create a radio shack at the Chesterfield BSA camp which will be accessible the year round. This facility will become the hub of the DX crew's radio activities. In addition, the crew has an open invitation from Dave Robbins to operate at his super station K1TTT in Peru, MA.

Old Business

Renewal Campaign: have Matt & Frandy submitted the ZB bills for September? (AA1YW) - Yes

Auction Planning: (KK1W) Marty, Matt, Dave, Bob, Frandy and Ed will staff the auction. Ed will be coordinating the auction set up and speaker system. KI1A has offered help with the audio system. Ed needs volunteers for table setup! Food Concession: who will volunteer? – Possibly the DX crew will run the food concession as a means of creating revenue to fund their proposed activities. So far, one possible donation.

Raffle prize: Wouxun HT. (KK1W)

Quarterly news letter: change from monthly to quarterly newsletter, should we do this? - tabled until next month.

Coffee service: do we need a better/different coffee machine for the meetings? – in an effort to make the monthly coffee sales a profitable endeavor and limit waste, AA1YW has been tasked with the purchase of two drip coffeemakers for meeting and FD use.

Monthly Raffles: Do we want to drop the monthly raffles? – Yes, in the future the DX Crew will run a 50/50% raffle, the proceeds will be split between the HCRA and the Crew.

New Business

HCRA Access Data Base: the newly uploaded read only copy of the current HCRA Access Data Base on the Yahoo BOD site was discussed and agreed to have been a positive move to enhance administrative queries.

Coffee Service: John, WA1JAE (our coffee volunteer) will not be able to continue his duties much longer because of family commitments. We need another volunteer. – Tabled until next meeting.

Refreshments: Mary, N1TOY has suggested healthier alternatives for snacks offered at the monthly meetings– an excellent idea to be implemented with Mary's help.



New for 2010 is the addition of the 31 Mexican states and the Federal District as multipliers. This will defi-

nitely bring new excitement to this great event!

- US Technicians have 10 meter SSB privileges from 28.3-28.5 MHz and are encouraged to get in on the fun! W/VE/XE stations (including Alaska and Hawaii) send a signal report and their state or province; DX stations (including Puerto Rico, US Virgin Islands and Pacific territories) send a signal report and sequential serial number.
