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## Civil Preparedness: Part III

### Type I disasters Continued- Part 3 or series

This month we will look at what would be expected in the event of an ocidental release of radioactivity in a generating plant, or the explosion and to prepare to meet some of these dangers.

In the event of a local nuclear catastrophe you may have to provide ommunications during an evacuation of many people. What are the evacution routes? Who would be in charge? What person is responsible for verall communication coordination between the Army, civil defense, local evernment, and the Red Cross? These groups do not always have the ability talk via radio to each other and amateur radio provides the best source all these agencies. Remember the Chelsea fire in 1973?)

Bob Phoenix, WAIDNB, is the Section Emergency Coordinator for Western ss. He is the person who would be responsible for coordinating all of the coups. By ARRL rules, He assumes command over all other ham officials. The individual county also has an EC. (Emergency Coordinator). Bing Leonar IQA is Hampden County's. In theory, an organization exists and drills be ready to meet a crisis like the forced, rapid evacuation of Springficultiford, and area towns. But what happens in even a minor emergency?

The untrained, unfamilar-with-net-procedure hams who pour out of the codwork to help are a real burden! Staying off the mike button is their ggest problem. False reports, too many chiefs, and massive traffic foul ps would soon screw up the evacuation. In 1968, during the Washington Dots, all the freeways into and out of the city were jammed solid. Emergacks and troops just could not get into the city! Why would the panic any different around Springfield when the degree of radiation danger we much more severe?

The way to save lives would be an efficient amateur radio network cordinating civil defense efforts. Knowing where to go and how to oranize it has to be done ahead of time. Hams would be amoung the last leave and this would preclude the luke-warm volunteers. We represent see only feasible way of disciplined community coordinated evacuation.

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Much more could be written on this. (i.e. How mediocre most area epeaters "public service" activities are.) Comments and suggestions see solicited. Next month in the last of the series, we will go over ome of the preparations you might want to make to be an effective source help during major social upheavals and regional weather disasters.

Coar George,

I have been the SEC for Western Mass for eight years in which time our ARES membership expanded from thirty-odd to one hundred forty, ECs have come and gone, and new calls have replaced many of the older ones. Numerous hams who register their availability the ARES are thereafter absent from any participation in ARES activities nor have eny contact with the section's organization. As an example, last month I received round-about information that one of our ARES members had been a silent key for over a year, but was unknowingly still listed on our our roster. Similar instances, where members may relocate outside of the section or have become inactive, have left us with a roster of calls, fifty percent of which are meaningless.

In February of this year, I proposed to the SCM and ECs of this section that a policy be adopted whereby full status in the ARES require participation at least once a month in one of our ARES nets. Failing this requirment would result in redesignated status of limited membership. Failure to be logged into at least one ARES session in a six month period results in removal from the ARES roster. Legitimate reason for non-compliance would be accepted and membership status continued where appropriate.

This policy proposal was considered and received the approval of the SCM and ECs. Following section-wide notification to the ARES membership via radio nets and club news-

letters, the policy went into effect on March 1, 1978.

I am enclosing this letter of explanation with my August report which shows the rship decline resulting from the adoption of this policy six months ago. There is nothing phony about our present membership numbers. The ECs, AECs, and current full members have participated in at least one session per month. The remaining limited members have checked in at least once (many more than once) inthe six month period. If further consideration or discussion of this policy is felt to be required, I welcome the opportunity to participate. Perhaps time will be available at the New England Convention.

In closing, may I express my gratitude to the Communications Department of the ARRL for the Public Service Award which I recently received. Many hams, whose efforts and personal sacrifice overshadowed my small contribution, does not detract from my pride in being a part of this type of public service and I again say thanks for the recognition.


