If you are interested in making a contribution to the club, this may be the opportunity for you. The editor of ZERO BEAT will retire at the end of the current club year and will train his replacement.



NEED A TOP*FLIGHT, HOME*BREW HF ANTENNA?

Four years ago, when I was about to move to Wilbraham, W4AD/TI2AD, Lou De La Fleur (a silent key since last month), sent me complete detailed plans for his TI2AD 3-band quad and associated home-brew spider. The design uses a single feedline and provides 1/8 wave length separation between driven loop and reflector loop on 10-15-20 meters. The spider is of welded construction using 1-inch angle iron throughout and weighs approximately 16 pounds.

I would have built this antenna myself when we first moved from Maryland if I had known how to find an expert welder who could achieve a precision assuring that the quad loops would lie in parallel planes. I still want to if anyone can find me such a welder. Lou and the friends who had copies of his antenna had, or have, some of the best signals coming out of Central and South America.

I will be happy to provide anyone who wants the TI2AD Quad plans with copies of the 4 sheets of drawings and detailed instructions that Lou sent me for just the 50 cents it costs me for first-class duplication. In a way, it is a memorial to Lou, who was always generous in helping any Ham who called on him.

In return, if anyone can put me in touch with a welder who can and will turn out a spider of acceptable accuracy, I would be most appreciative. Maybe if enough HCRA members are interested, a job lot of spiders would make preparation of a suitable jig more attractive.

Dear Bert,

Just a short note to enclose the drawings of the boomless quad. Anyone who can weld can put the center spider together very easily and using 1" angle iron, you can actually use less length in the square cross members but the angle irons that support the spreaders have to be long enough so that when you put the spreaders in you will have at least 13'2" from the center of the cross pieces to the ends of the spreaders. The spreaders you can get on the market from Shakespeare or other manufacturers usually run 12'6" in length so the angle iron has to make up the additional 8 or 10 inches.

To put it in the diamond configuration, the pipe support should be welded to the end of one of the square cross members.

The design is very flexible as to making adaptations to it. The important dimensions are the wire lengths which should be tuned and adjusted before raising the tower (easy with a crank-down, tilt-over tower) and the 19° angle which gives the one-eighth wavelength spacing on all bands.


I have modified the 10 meter section by putting an insulator on each side so that what you have is really a dipole (bent) with another dipole (also bent) above it but excited parasitically. This minimizes the interaction which may be evident when on ten meters and caused by the twenty meter element. There is no interaction when on twenty from the ten meter element in either case.

The diamond configuration gives better drainage of water and sleet during icing conditions. A simple TV rotor will turn the whole array but is not recommended because they are not built substantially enough.

Make all colls self-supporting and not touching insulators except at end support points. Colls should be approximately 1 1/2" in diameter with turns exceed 1/0" to 1/4" exart. Adjustment of the reflecture is accomplished by squarals: the turns together (to a feetively lengthen the reflector) or spreading that approximation to affectively shorten the reflector. The boing should be used if aviation-otherwise connect the common (CGCU or EGILU) directly across the insulator.


