## Silent Auctions to benefit HCRA

Thanks to a generous donation from the estate of Al Drake, N1CQT we will be offering to our members a chance to obtain some fine equipment at a "silent auction" held during the September and October club meetings.

Some of you may remember Al. He was for many years an active part of our club meetings and Field Day. Starting out as KA1GPX back in the 70's Al was always on the air on some band or mode. He operated from home and mobile on HF and VHF. He was never far from his favorite hobby and wanted his equipment to benefit HCRA and its members. Sadly Al left us a few years ago after a brief bout with the big "C". His widow contacted us a short while ago and asked if we could pick up his equipment.

Usually we take these type of donations for the annual November Auction. This time we thought, especially since Al specifically wanted his equipment to go to the club, to make some of them available to our members, and only our members, at a silent auction. This way you get an opportunity to bid on items you want for your shack without fighting it out with a hundred other buyers. The equipment is in VG condition, much of it has been tested and can be taken home and put on the air with little or no effort.

Because this month's Zero Beat is pretty short notice we will put some of the items on sale this month and the balance (the really good stuff!) will be brought to the October meeting. Any items not selling will be put on sale at the November Auction. Not all the equipment is going to the silent auction, some was put into HCRA Field Day stock, some donated to Crew DX for use at the Moses Scout reservation, some will go to eBay and the least desirable will go to the auction.

When you come to the meeting there will be a display of equipment with a bid sheet in front of each item. Simply put down your name/call on the list and your bid. That's all there is to it! You can go back as often as you want if you want to win the bid. At the end of the night the high bidder pays the treasurer and takes their item home. Simple enough? There will be a minimum bid for some of the equipment but it won't be revealed until after the auction, and then only if the minium hasn't been met. Remember every dollar of your purchase goes directly to the HCRA treasury to fund our yearly events. Following is a list of items for sale at the September meeting. We will publish Octobers list in next month's Zero Beat. There's going to be some great stuff at both meetings, you'll want to be sure to check next month's list too. Oh, just one more thing – in order to bid you MUST be a current HCRA member because as we said at the beginning – this opportunity is for 'members only'!

# My Field Day with the Bear Bait Radio Club

Field Day weekend is a ham radio activity that I always get excited about. This year was no different. While I have been yearning for the past few years to do something different than going to Dufresne Park, I have still participated with the HCRA over the years.

So as things started ramping up for this year, I found out that my son Jacob, KB1NSN, needed to be at his summer job the Sunday of Field Day weekend. It wasn't just that he needed to be there, it was the fact that it was 270 miles from the Springfield area. He was hired by BSA Camp Massawepie which is located about 10 miles west of Tupper Lake in NY. I was bummed. No joining the guys for FD this year.

Then I started thinking – there *must* be a Lake Placid radio club or one nearby. I used the ARRL Field Day locater and googled radio clubs for the Adirondacks. I found as few, mapped them and emailed them asking about joining their Field Day. I did get invitations to three clubs. The closest to Lake Placid was *120 miles away!* That was too far no matter how good the invite sounded. (Lake Placid is only 230 miles/4.5 hours from Springfield). Finally, a few short weeks before FD, I found a much closer club: The Bear Bait Radio Club.



I emailed them asking if I could participate on Saturday and do some CW. I coordinated originally with Scott, then with Tom, WA2DAD. He said they were thrilled to have a "CW" guy come and participate and demo CW. Uh oh, I was the only CW guy?

I got a rough cross road for my gps and away we went on Saturday morning. I did pack my 570, paddles, headphones and a tote of stuff just in case plus my powerpoles and crimper in case too. I was ready for nearly anything plus had 3 antennas with me as well. The drive there took about two hours and the roads seemed to go on and on forever.

The club was setup in the pavilion on Mt. Sabbatis in Long Lake, NY. It was 62 miles from the campground. Off we went traveling thru some beautiful country, mountains everywhere and lakes calling me to paddle them as well. I also noticed that nearly the whole ride was at 1600 feet elevation.



Soon enough we arrived at Long Lake and found the Field Day location. It was in the pavilion, a few wire antennas were in the trees and one funky vertical or rotating dipole mounted on the back of a truck.

Jake and I were immediately welcomed in. Jake helped get some balls with rope into the trees (strong arm) with ease and I met everyone and scoped it out. My station was to be a Yaesu FT-857 on a dipole on 20m. I added my trusty Vibroplex Chrome Code Warrior paddles and headphones. Logging was by hand.

The logging threw me off a bit. I did have my laptop with me, but there was no cell signal, so I couldn't hook up and download a logging program. I stuck with the paper. I copied the CW on a pad, numbered the contacts, added the time, freq and report and then transferred it all to the log. A bit tedious and I averaged about 3 minutes to a contact. Not my best times, but it was FUN!

I was operating KC2ZZO 5A NNY. I had to be careful as, without thinking, I sent W1NY a few times as well as my own call or a mix of all. It was easy enough to do without a memory keyer. Everything was manual. Did I say it was great fun?

The 857 also didn't have any CW filters, so I was playing with the digital signal processing a bit and got it working acceptably. I guess I was spoiled all those years with the HCRA?

I spent about 4 hours doing this. Sitting on a picnic table and operating. Drinking my Mountain Dew from my Nalgene and getting numb butt after about 4 hours. I also had hams and non-hams come over and chat and ask about CW. Many had *heard* about it but never heard or saw (Continued on next page)

anyone operating it. I probably spent 90 minutes of my 4 hours discussing ham radio and CW too with everyone that stopped by. Most thanked me for coming out and participating with them and giving them the CW contacts. During my time with the guys I learned that they are almost all from the Syracuse area. The club operates there and comes up to Long Lake a few times per year for contests and they have started teaching ham radio to some locals who have now earned their tech licenses. Each Fall they do a weekend cram class and average 80% pass rates. There is a slowly growing ham community in Long Lake, NY where there never was one before.



All in all, it was a great time. Without the help of some technology, having to manually log, send, etc. it surprised me how much fun going back to simplicity it was. I was very happy to have found a club and participated with them.
