ven with a small snowstorm our Technician Classes got off to a great start. Sixteen students braved the inclement weather and showed up for the first of eight sessions that will culminate (hopefully) with a new Technician Class license. The level of preparation and enthusiasm shown by the class was impressive. Most everyone had obtained their copy of "Now You're Talking" and were well prepared for the evenings lecture.

The first part of the class was an introduction to ham radio with some live demonstrations. As luck would have it, the demo went well. Live QSO's from the Mt. Tom repeater, QSO's in progress from Kentucky on the HCRA IRLP node and listening to a ham in California calling CQ on 20 meters excited the class. Following the demos Barry, N1 JK helped the group understand the basics of the metric system and Norm, W1BMK used some plumbing analogies to explain just how those little electrons get around in copper wires.





HCRA History Series:

Where did the word "ham" come from?



Here are Mr. and Mrs. Roger Spicer of Hampden with Roger's 1000 watt station in the basement of his home. Roger was licensed in 1920, He is one of the pioneer ham radio operators of New England.



Pictured receiving Morse code here is Arthur Zaverella of Station WIMNG, Agawam. Art has been licensed for ham operation since 1922. He holds the position of Agawam Civil Defense director and has, in his spare time, made radio contacts all over the world, contacting such far places as the Belgian Congo and New Zealand.

Radio 'Hams'

Ham radio operators have pioneered general radio broadcasting since 1917, when wireless was the means of local and world-wide communications. The significance of the word "ham" originated, interestingly enough when the British added an "h" to some of their words, resulting in "hamateur" being abbreviated to "ham," indicating a person new and inexperienced in the field. Actually, a true ham radio operator, unlike a commercial two-way radio operator, is licensed to operate radio units up to 1000 watts, permitting world-wide communication. He must also be proficient in his knowledge and use of the Morse code. Western Massachusetts has many FCC licensed operators, some of whom are shown in this roto feature.
