Dr. DX Mike DeChristopher, K1KAA

Welcome to November! It is only a matter of time before the snow flies. Hopefully, all of your antenna modifications are completed, the guy wires are tightened, and you are ready for a productive DX and contest season. There are plenty of good DX'peditions still parked where they are, even though CQ World Wide has come and gone. You can still catch that rare one, even with one hundred watts and a tribander.

I am told propagation is on the upswing, but I rarely believe that, especially with the pessimist-procuring conditions we have had over the past several years. Then, I heard that wonderful, turbulent, wavering CW signal creep through my earphones on 15 meters at around 0152Z. Ladies and gentlemen, the JA's are back on 15, and they have brought a wave of long-path QSO's, the likes of which haven't been seen since the peak of the last cycle. Point those beams north, because it is only going to get better.

I remember when I first received my HF privileges. I sat down in from of the radio, called CQ on 20 meters for about five minutes, and got my first DX – Israel! Conditions were great then, since it was the peak of the cycle. I can see it starting to lean that way again. Give it time, a little luck, and some occasional QRO (10 meters has to get knocked around a little to wake up), and you will be working those needed lands.

Things here are also on the increase. With a new desk extension, the shack is much more comfortable. Another issue that needed to be fixed was the alleged "God-awful" keyclicks I am prone to. In fact, there is an article online describing what a keyclick is and how to prevent it. I read up on the article, hoping to learn the source of my problem, and listened to the embedded audio clip. Come to find out, the clip was actually of me! To make a long story short, I managed to find a modification to fix the clicks. Now, I can terrorize the bands with my sloppy code – but at least I'll only poison one frequency at a time, since I won't have a massive keyclick to either side.

I hope every else's improvements happened, and happened well. It is finally time to put them to the test. Here are the announced DX operations for November:

Remote Desk Topping

What is Remote Desktopping and what does it have to do with ham radio?

While I was having dinner last month with Chuck, N1UC, we got to talking about controlling a station remotely. In fact, he touched on the subject during his talk later that evening.

Imagine this: It's the dead of winter, 12 degrees outside and windy. You're at work on your lunch break and you just *know* that seventeen-meters is hopping, but it's just too c-c-cold outside to sit in your car to make a few contacts on your mobile HF rig.

Well, with the same rig-to-soundcard interface you use for digital modes, your rig control program and couple of freeware programs, you can sit at your work computer (providing that you have internet access at work) and operate your home ham station... from work!

If you don't have Windows XP Pro or Windows Server (or the like) installed on your shack PC, you'll have to download and install some type of VNC software on it. There are quite a few of them out there to choose from. If you have a router installed at home too, things do get a little bit trickier in regards to porting through the router... but not impossible by any means.

The other bit of free software you need is something called Skype. It's a VoIP program for voice chat and making telephone calls from the internet.

Once you've got it all installed and working, all you do is access your shack computer from work (the Remote Desktop part), place a call via Skype from your work PC to the shack PC, answer the call through the remote desktop feature, and then launch your rig control program. Presto! You're making contacts on your rig at home from your desk at work!

Oh, I almost forgot! At work you're going to need a microphone on your PC too. What about the delay with digital voice you ask? Well, yes there is a small one. But it's no worse than what you experience with your cell phone.

I'm in the process now of building a new interface for my own shack so I can get this whole thing up and running. Rest assured that when it's all running, I'll write another article about it along with a few pictures and schematics.

So, stay tuned!

ARRL 10 Meter Contest is just around the corner!


This year's contest starts at 0000Z December 9th (Friday at 7PM EST) and ends at 2359 UTC on December 10th (Sunday at 7:00 PM EST). That's a total of 48 hours but not to worry, the band will most likely be open for less than half of that time. The ARRL 10M contest is a fun time that won't take up your entire weekend.

So what's so good about the 10M contest? For starters it is a contest that both allows you to compete as an individual <u>AND</u> submit your score for the club aggregate. It's a short contest, not a weekend killer. You will get a chance to make contacts across the country and around the world. Did I say it is fun?

Propagation plays a big part in this contest and since we are at the bottom of the solar cycle don't expect a score like we had in 2002. The chart below shows our scores over the last four years as well as the number of club members submitting logs. How do you think we will do this year? It all depends on a few things. If we doubled the number of participants the score should jump up quite a bit. What if the band opens? The score will really jump then. Did you know that 10M was open at midnight during Field Day this year? Who know what the gods of propagation will bring to 10 Meters this weekend? The one thing I know for sure is: *the more operators, the bigger the score and the more fun you have!*

If you have a Technician Plus or higher license class you are good to go. Still a tech or a novice, then see if you can join another operator and let the fun begin. When the contest is all over simply send your log into ARRL and list 'Hampden County Radio Assn.' as your affiliated club and your done until next year. The only requirement is you must be a member of HCRA.

If you have any other questions about this fun event drop me an email and I'll do my best to help you out. Lets see how many members we can get this year to join in the fun. The ARRL 10 Meter Contest is the perfect way to spend a few hours not shopping for holiday gifts. Relax, have fun with your hobby and help put HCRA on the map.
