Thanks for your support and if you want to put a little 'extra' in as a donation it would be greatly appreciated.

What is your club working on for the 2009/2010 season?

Here's a few of the things we have on our radar screen:

1. Holiday Party – We're looking at the Steaming Tender again this year with a buffet meal priced around \$20/person. Possible dates are December 7'th or 8th. Just like last year the entire train station will be ours so we can be as loud and boisterous as we want and not disturb anyone. Also planned are some door prizes and recognition awards. We're looking for some ideas, suggestion and of course help. Are you ready to raise your hand?

2. **Zero Beat** - Publishing, printing and mailing Zero Beat costs more than a member's dues! Hard to believe but true. Last year it cost \$16.66/member for



each member getting a mailed Zero Beat. We are seriously considering following the lead of other organizations and going to 100% electronic distribution. In the interim mailed (paper) copies of Zero Beat will be restricted to a maximum of four pages (typically two after September). Please help us and the HCRA budget by requesting a mailed copy ONLY if you truly don't have access to the electronic version. The bonus to you is the electronic version is in color will have more content, pictures and more. Thanks!

3. Field Day - Continuing our efforts in fiscal conservatism we are definitely looking for a Field Day site that won't cost us \$500 to \$750 rental fees. One site is under serious consideration but if you think you know of a good location let's hear about it. Potential sites should be close to Springfield if possible, allow camping and night access, have reasonable facilities and hopefully are free. HCRA has a liability policy in place so our access to public sites shouldn't create any insurance issues.

By-law Review - A by-law committee is reviewing our present by-laws. Irv, W6IS and George, KC1V have volunteered and will be looking for adjustments that will bring our by-laws into better convergence with changes that have taken place over the last few decades. The committee's goal is to have a proposal ready for membership approval by January 2010.

For the rest of 2009 look for Mike Raisbeck, K1TWF at our October meeting, the annual HCRA auction in November and of course the Holiday Party and the ARRL 10 Meter contest in December. Whew! Isn't that enough for the next few months!


