This past June, the Hampden County Radio Association Field Day Team put in a superb effort for the yearly Field Day contest. We ran transmitter class 9A, which means that we had as many as 9 transmitters on the air *simultaneously!* The weather, operators, and bands held out, and we all had a great time. Here's a quick rundown of each operating position set up:

160 meters—W1KK: Drake TR5, longwire antenna, and solar charged batteries to obtain bonus points.

80 meters—NQ1C: Yaesu FT-767, 320 foot zepp antenna.

40 meter CW—K1XM: Icom IC731, 2 element delta beam at 70 feet.

40 meter SSB—N1DPM: Icom IC765, 2 element delta beam at 70 feet.

20 meter CW—NO1Z: Icom IC781, 3 element yagi at 70 feet.

20 meter SSB—KA1ZE: Icom IC781, 3 element yagi at 60 feet.

17 meters—W1KK: TR5, longwire.

15 meter CW—NC1B: Kenwood TS940S, 4 element yagi at 40 feet.

15 meter SSB—KA1KRJ: Kenwood TS440, 4 element yagi at 30 feet.
